

Candy Murphy enters her 5<sup>th</sup> season with Boise River Volleyball Club, and will begin her 3<sup>rd</sup> year as Club Director. She will take over coaching duties as the 16-1 coach for the 2010 club season.

Murphy was recently named an assistant coach at Boise State University where she trains the athletes for competition, assists with recruiting, oversees scouting of opponents & video exchange, and works to build alumni relations,

Murphy served as the top assistant coach at Sacramento State from 1993-98. She spent the 1999 season as an assistant at Stanford helping the Cardinal to a 2<sup>nd</sup> place finish at the NCAA Tournament. Murphy returned to Sacramento State in 2001. While at Sacramento, the Hornets compiled a record of 174-63, multiple Big Sky Conference Championships and NCAA Tournament appearances.

A two-time first team All-American at UC Davis, Murphy came to Sacramento State fresh off a career as one of the best players in UC Davis volleyball history. The Northern California Athletic Conference Player of the Year in 1991 and 1992, Murphy earned first team American Volleyball Coaches Association All-America honors as a junior and senior. In addition, she earned all-Northern California Athletic Conference honors all four years. For her efforts, she was inducted into the UC Davis Hall of Fame in 1998.

Prior to Sacramento State, she coached in numerous capacities at the club level throughout the greater Sacramento area. She has had teams place 5<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> in the open division at Junior Olympics. She has coached 27 athletes who have played at the NCAA Division I level, most receiving full athletic scholarships.

A graduate of UC Davis, Murphy earned her bachelor's degree in human development in 1993.

Along with her family, Candy moved to Eagle, ID in 2004. She has two children, Jackson (9) and Katherine (6).
