

Keri Coats is heading into her fourth season with Boise River and will take over the reigns as the 17-National coach. Coats just completed her first season as the Varsity Head Coach for Meridian High School

Coats first started coaching during the spring of 2006 where she joined the Sooner Volleyball Club as the 16-2 coach. In the fall of 2006, Coats moved from Oklahoma back to Idaho where she joined the Boise River Volleyball Club.

Coats began playing volleyball in junior high and finished her senior year at Twin Falls High School as the Magic Valley Volleyball Player of the Year. Coats then played two years at the College of Southern Idaho as a right side hitter where she helped her team take fifth (2001) and third (2002) at the Junior College National Championships and finish with a 79-8 record over the two year span. She transferred her junior year to the University of Oklahoma where she continued to play on the right side. In 2003 Coats was sidelined toward the last half of the season due to a stress fracture in her left leg but remained a contributing factor for the year by finishing second in aces and total blocks and fourth in kills. During her senior season (2004), Coats helped the team set a new school record with seven straight wins while finishing second in kills and total blocks.

Coats earned her BA in Marketing from the University of Oklahoma in 2006.

She currently resides in Boise where she continues to fulfill her passion by playing and coaching volleyball.
